


Yearly Performance Graphs



Total Assets


Greater Alliance FCU continued to see growth in member deposits, which brought Total Assets to over \$237 Million. Growth was about 4%, which was similar to the overall industry averages for the state of NJ. Greater Alliance continues to be the 14th largest Credit Union in the State.

Total Capital



Your Credit Union continues to operate as well capitalized as defined by the National Credit Union Administration. 2021 was a year that was spent building back the safety cushion utilized in the prior year to help membership weather the financial storm from the diffuculty of early COVID-19. Capital represents 8.08% of Assets for 2021, up from 7.74% in the prior year.

Total Loans




After a step back in 2020, loan volume increased significantly in 2021. Overall new loan volume was \$60,304,864 as a significant number of members took advantage of the low rate environment. Specifically, over \$35 Million in 1st and 2nd Mortgage Loans were booked for the year. Greater Alliance continues to offer great rates and expects to have another successful lending year in 2022.
